**Nature of support 2011/12****Individual and small group support – supporting academic progress****All Saints' CE Junior School**

Children eligible for PPG were identified and monitored as a vulnerable group. During termly pupil progress meetings these children were discussed, needs were identified and plans were formulated.

Children in each year group received withdrawn support led by a teaching assistant, though planned by a teacher, with a focus on specific targets clearly identified as holding them back academically. These were monitored regularly and planning was adjusted to meet needs. Some children received 1:1 support, others received small group interventions, depending on the need.

**Individual and small group support – supporting pastoral, social and behavioural needs**

An additional member of staff was employed to support children and families. This member of staff was able to act as Lead Professional in CAFs, participate and lead in Social service cases, work with families as a trained Triple P parenting specialist, work with children on a 1:1 or small group basis to work on developing social skills, establishing friendship groups, leading anger management work, leading "Me Club" and act as 1<sup>st</sup> line behaviour management across the school.

The aim was to provide an effective link between school and home.

This post was appointed part way through the financial year.

Other ways that the grant has been spent:

Funding 'Wider Opportunities' from the County Music Service (CMS), enabling every child to receive a full year of instrument tuition from a specialised music teacher. This tuition takes place in Year 3.

Funding school trips and either partially or fully-funding participation in Year 6 residential trip.

Funding on-going 1:1 tuition and small group support. PPG was also used to fund additional support in the classes.

## **Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2011/12**

### **All Saints' CE Junior School**

To improve self-esteem, confidence and behaviour in individual pupils, thereby improving participation in school life.

To support children in reading, writing and maths.

## **Measuring the impact of PPG spending**

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end of each term. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention.

There will also be a focus on measuring progress in social development, using the SEAL progress indicators for Personal, Social, Emotional and Behavioural Measures. This will assist in evaluating participation and attitude towards learning, increasing independence in learning and will also be judged against attendance figures.

The ultimate aim is for there to be no gap between children claiming FSM and those that don't.
